

Excerpt #1 from draft of Ben Davidson's Upcoming Book

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"Why did you come here uninvited?" - Spencer J. Atkinson

I would be lying if I said I felt welcome among the majority of the mainstream media, scientists, and professors, although the it is getting better for an 'outsider' every day. It was much easier to ignore and shove aside newer ideas before they had solid data behind them, but even now the fortress of the entrenched old-guard is nearly impenetrable, and ever as resistant to change. We will discuss these issues specifically in later chapters; I bring this point up now because, from a certain point of view, I have no right to be doing what I do.

I do not have a degree in science, but rather in economics. My advanced degree is a Juris Doctorate, not a Ph.D. in physics. My previous work experience includes a clerkship for Justice Pfeiffer in the Supreme Court of Ohio, and a few years as due diligence analyst for a successful equity finance organization in Columbus, Ohio. If you have experience in the equity or legal world, then you are no longer surprised that I am doing what I do.

Nobody can memorize all the laws and cases, so a huge part of law school is teaching you to find answers, collate information, make judgements on the merits of opposing points of view, interpret complex material, and communicate your conclusions in an understandable way. Due diligence is a bit like forensics or investigative journalism only there is technically no right answer like "who stabbed that guy?" or "where did this money go?" Instead you are taking the best guesses of experts and telling someone what to do with a lot more money than you've ever seen, and which will ultimately depend on a number of factors that cannot be known at the present time. That is exactly what I do now, just in a different field.

What most people like to call "portfolio diversification" seems like a lack of focus to a due diligence analyst, one that can force him or her to master a new topic every few weeks. In my firm, I worked with mining opportunities and biomimetic chemistry - not exactly what I do now, but it certainly energized a love of science I had fumbled some time ago...

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I have no idea why I felt a need to communicate the findings of my BS-detector [in the form of YouTube videos], but I can promise that it is much easier to dissect issues in this community than it is to make judgements between teams of Ph.D. scientists who say the exact opposite things about a diligence point where millions of dollars are on the line. When I began explaining why the comet was no great conspiracy two things became apparent - I divided my viewers by those who were willing to look at evidence, and those who just wanted to believe the worst of things. I have watched this happen with comets Lovejoy (2010) and ISON and Siding Spring, with at least 8 different doomsday dates failed involving asteroids, solar prophecy, ebola, or WW3. Nothing ever happens, and yet one could not deny that there were literally 5 or 6 grand coincidences about Elenin. It became clear that there was something fishy going on - and it is called controlling the opposition. That topic requires a book of its own but suffice to say that there are stories that are planted or controlled or twisted in order to gain information about how we react, about what we believe, and to alter the perception of an entire community.

During the time I was becoming Mr. Don't Panic in the conspiracy community, also I began to learn about Agenda 21, the real scope of influence of secret societies, the prepper lifestyle, weather modification, the potential for civility to falter for a multitude of reasons, and earth's changing magnetic field and climate. I was 'waking up' to the things that most of us are too distracted to notice. If you have never experienced this feeling or are unfamiliar with the alternative information realm, this and the preceding paragraphs make no sense to you, but suffice to say that the natural world and backdoor politics are both far more interesting than hollywood and E! want you to believe. In fact, much of what we take for granted depends on the majority of us being distracted from what is really taking place behind the scenes, and just how close everything is to spiraling out of control.

Frankly, I question the effort because the majority of people are not awake and are not going to listen to us anyway. They know what has to happen to baby cows to get the best veal. They know what hardships that children across the planet are suffering. They know that if we eat better and exercise we will spend less money on healthcare that only ends up prescribing what amounts to poison, which costs yet more money and morbidity to be treated in a similar way. They just don't care. Or if they do, they are unwilling to change or do anything about the perceived malfeasance. I doubt the

majority would do anything at all if they knew the truth - I think it takes the right kind of person.

For months on end, even while I applied the perfect set of skills and experience for such a search for truth, I was incorrectly convinced that there were only two possibilities at hand. Either the world was coming to an end, and everything was corrupt and conspiracy - OR - everything and everyone in this community was either completely full of crap or suffering from a mass delusion. If the latter were true, surely I was already entertaining the fantasy.

Neither reality is true. While the loudest voices seemed to have the most questionable predictions and methods, there were shades of merit in every corner of this community of truth seekers, preppers, conspiracy theorists, curious minds, and suspicious observers. So where is the disconnect? Some of the foundations of the community are also its weaknesses. In order to wake up you need to open your mind to something beyond what appears to be the all-encompassing everything of the world flashing in front of your face every time you look at a screen. You need to have faith in your intuition when friends and family lack vision- and yet you must question that which you are told to believe. I'll leave your religion to you, but when it comes to the people on in politics and the media you'd be crazy to simply have faith. You also need to come to terms with the fact that the last few centuries have been an anomalous calm period on this planet like nothing our ancestors ever described, and that may be coming to an end soon, if humans don't screw things up first.
